Commissioner Marlon Miller called the meeting to order at 9:06 A.M. Commissioners Will Fine was also present. Commissioner Lee Doolen was absent.

Fine led the prayer and Miller led the flag salute.

No Citizen's Comments

Commissioner Lee Doolen arrived at 9:07 A.M.

The invoices for the emergency services from Gateway were provided to the Commissioners for review. Judy Smith spoke on behalf of Gateway to Prevention & Recovery and discussed how funding stopped being received from Oklahoma Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse. Judy is looking for other funding sources and has applied for the Opioid Abatement Grant on behalf of Lincoln County to be awarded on the 18th if approved. Judy is also consulting with Healthy Mind for guidelines to schedule a meeting with the Attorney General's office to discuss state funds. Gateway is currently servicing 30-35 court ordered people a week being paid by Gateway. If Chandler must close those individuals would have to travel to surrounding areas such as Shawnee, Tulsa or Stillwater. The Commissioners asked how funding would be secured in the future due to the County only having limited restricted funds available in the Opioid Settlement Fund. The Commissioners main concern is protecting the county budget and can't sustain permanent funds. Commissioner Doolen asked about prevention instead of just treatment. Prevention is being done through court ordered parental services to start prevention at home. The Commissioner thanked Judy Smith for all the work she has done. Judy invited the Commissioners to the Reaching Rural meeting September 12, at the Fair Grounds. Fine made a motion to approve payment of the emergency services provided by Gateway from the Opioid Abatement Settlement Fund. Motion seconded by Miller. Doolen, Miller and Fine all voted aye.

Miller made a motion to approve Nextiva quote for 2 recording lines in the Sheriff Office for \$11,900 more. Motion seconded by Fine. Doolen, Miller and Fine all voted aye.

Miller made a motion to approve the following Transfer of Appropriations and Transfer of Funds:

- Error Correction \$11,287.68 from General Government Opioid Settlement to 2024 Attorney General Opioid Abatement Grant Program due to payment from wrong account.
- Motion seconded by Fine. Doolen, Miller and Fine all voted aye.
