

RESOLUTION No. 25- 1166

Lincoln County is requesting approval and adoption of the resolution affirming the county's commitment to the reduction of fatal and serious injury crashes and its accompanying targeted percentage reduction in fatal and serious injury by the year 2045, by recommending adoption of the following:

A RESOLUTION OF COMMITMENT TO LINCOLN COUNTY SAFETY ACTION PLAN

WHEREAS, traffic crashes were significant causes of death and injuries between 2017-2021, totaling 40 fatal and 102 incapacitating injury crashes in Lincoln County; and

WHEREAS, the life, safety, and health of Lincoln County residents, employees, and visitors are of upmost priority; and

WHEREAS, the [Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act \(IIJA\)](#), aka [Bipartisan Infrastructure Law \(BIL\)](#) Law established the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary program and funds regional, local, and Tribal initiatives through grants to prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries; and

WHEREAS, Lincoln County entered into a grant agreement for the preparation of a Safety Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, Lincoln County's Safety Action Plan was developed to meet the federal goals of an SS4A Action Plan which is to develop a holistic, well-defined strategy to prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries in a locality, Tribal area, or region; and

WHEREAS, Lincoln County's Safety Action Plan has been completed and includes the federally required key components of a SS4A Action Plan for successful implementation: 1) planning structure; 2) safety analysis; 3) engagement and collaboration with the public and stakeholders; 4) policy and process changes; 5) strategy and project selections; and 6) progress and transparency; and 7) this resolution serves as the leadership commitment from Lincoln county; and

WHEREAS, Lincoln County is recommending approval and adoption of the County goal year of 2040 and accompanying fatal and serious injury crash percentage reduction goals of 20 percent by 2030, 50 percent by 2035, 75 percent by 2045.

WHEREAS, Lincoln County desires to implement the Safety Action Plan within the authority and boundaries of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THIS 22ND DAY OF SEPTEMBER 2025, BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF LINCOLN COUNTY, OKLAHOMA ADOPTS THE PLAN AND GOALS SET FORTH:
